12.00pm CARRIE (1976)

A troubled young girl, bullied by her peers and fanatical fundamentalist mother, discovers she has telekinetic powers. Carrie was the first of Stephen King's works to be adapted for the big screen and remains one of the best, marking Brian De Palma's arrival as a major director.

1.45pm THE HILLS HAVE EYES (1977)

Horror master Wes Craven achieved success with A Nightmare on Elm Street but this seminal effort remains his masterpiece and one of the defining moments in American horror cinema. A family has the misfortune to break down in an area closed to the public and inhabited by monstrous cannibals.

3.25pm SUSPIRIA (1976)

A newcomer to a prestigious ballet academy discovers the school is a front for something sinister amidst a series of grisly murders. Abandoning giallo for a menacing brew of witchcraft, Italian auteur Dario Argento carves a Baroque nightmare, saturated with colour and punctuated by shocking violence.

5.20pm RE-ANIMATOR (1985)

One of the most celebrated, outrageous and original horror films of all time, Stuart Gordon's darkly comic tale takes gore to new levels. Based on HP Lovecraft's classic, a dedicated medical student becomes involved in bizarre experiments when a new student arrives on campus.

7.20pm THE BROOD (1979)

A recently separated single father tries to uncover an unconventional psychologist's therapy techniques on his institutionalised wife amidst a series of brutal murders in cult director David Cronenberg's disturbing and graphic horror film.

9.10pm HELLRAISER (1987)

Something evil lurks beneath the floorboards of a dilapidated house, something that wants human blood. Introducing the iconic Pinhead and his sadistic band of Cenobites, Clive Barker's movie became an instant classic and remains one of the most frighteningly original visions in horror.

11.00pm PHANTASM (1979)

A teenage boy, his older brother and local ice cream man discover their local mortuary hides a legion of hooded killer dwarfs, a flying drill-ball and the demonic mortician known as The Tall Man who enslaves the souls of the damned in the first of Don Coscarelli's classic horror franchise.
